THE Chair of the group of 'neighbourhood champions' who spent their own time developing and writing the Sprotbrough Neighbourhood Plan has thanked those residents who voted to adopt the document.

Eric Mirfin said: "As Chair of the Sprotbrough Neighbourhood Planning Group (SNPG), I would like to send my heart felt thanks to residents for voting in favour of the plan being adopted in the recent referendum.

"The Plan was six years in the making and represents the thoughts and wishes of residents, in terms of what's good about Sprotbrough and therefore what needs to be protected for the future, and what isn't so good with clear recommendations made for change.

"As a group we are very proud of what we have achieved and we hope that you, and future generations of Sprotbrough residents will be too."

The vote was 633 in favour of 'wanting Doncaster Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Sprotbrough to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area', with 138 against and two rejected.

Doncaster Council are expected to agree to adopt the Plan - which has been supported along its development journey by Sprotbrough & Cusworth Parish Council and Sprotbrough Ward Councillor Cynthia Ransome - at their meeting on 23 September, 2021.

Coun Tony Nicholson, Chair of the Parish Council paid tribute

to the tireless work of the SNPG members.

He said; "It has been a complicated process, ensuring the documentation meets all the Government's detailed requirements before it could be submitted. Six years is a long time to be involved but the final product will be a valuable planning guide for the area for many years to come.

"Thanks again to the Group for carrying out this work for the benefit of all the residents of Sprotbrough."

The Plan will play a key role in helping determine how Sprotbrough will grow in the next 15 years. It was produced following wide consultation with local people over the years.

In 2017, a questionnaire was pushed through the letterboxes of over 3,160 homes and businesses in Sprotbrough.

Some 697 were completed and returned - a 22 per cent response rate - which in marketing terms was considered to be highly successful. The findings led to the production of a 22-page report, which set the direction of the Plan.

The Autumn 2017 edition of this newsletter - which was door-dropped into every home - carried an extensive report on residents' responses, grouped around the questionnaire's themes of: Use of facilities; Future facilities; Houses; Work; Traffic and parking.

EVERY year the parish council awards a number of grants to local good causes that benefit residents living in the area we serve.



Through the decades such donations, which are called Section 137 grants, have helped make a big difference to many voluntary organisations that do fantastic work in our communities. Recently we have awarded grants of £300 to a play group at Sprotbrough Methodist Church (Goldsmith Centre) to pay for toys and books; £400 to the Sprotbrough Scarecrow Festival; £800 to the 28th Doncaster Guides; £1,000 to the health and well-being programme at Sprotbrough Library; and £326 to the Don Gorge Community Group to pay for their annual insurance. Their volunteers have recently restored this stonewall near Sprotbrough Falls

Genturian Lilian

CONGRATULATIONS to a well-known long-standing former Sprotbrough resident and true 'character' on clocking up her 100th birthday.

Lilian Haw reached her century in April this year. She lived with her son Trevor Miller at the former rectory on Boat Lane and then at Park Drive, before ill health meant a move to residential care at Tickhill, where she has been for the past seven years.

Lilian, a self-confessed petrolhead, passed on her love of cars to Trevor and the pair regularly went to rallies together for decades, as he built up a superb collection of vintage vehicles. Her first car was a 1964 Ford Consul Corsair, which later fell to bits, as did her next car, a Volvo, 10 years later. This was followed by a run of five BMW 3-series, which Trevor says "all developed engine problems at 100,000 miles".



A former nurse at Doncaster Royal Infirmary, Lilian's first husband, businessman William Miller, sadly died in the mid-1960s. She was later a teacher at Scawthorpe's Jossey Lane Infants School where she met her second husband, Christopher Haw.

Trevor said: "Many readers will remember Mum, she was very active in Sprotbrough village life and met the Princess of Wales in 1987 through her work for the Doncaster and District Association for the Welfare of the Disabled. She is now in a poor state of health but I treasure this picture of the last time I took her out for a car ride after picking her up at the care home."
